Hello Congregation...It's my turn to share something and I thought I'd take the opportunity to tell you about the awesome crew and technology we've been using to bring service to your devices during our lockdown. First, it should be known that none of us were experts with this software, but learned quickly - so if you're interested in being a part of the production crew, please let me know because this software is quite user friendly. In fact, I recall pitching the idea of streaming possibilities when I shared the A/V plan with the committee and session right before COVID.

Basically, we've used existing sound equipment, and added a few Apple devices that were purchased through a grant from the Presbytery. John Reiter and Logan Sorey initially came up with the design, as Logan had used this "Switcher" software with USF in his Master's program to stream their College of Music concerts. Everything you see on your Facebook stream comes from one iPad, which "controls" other (innumerous) small iPhones, for use of their cameras. Our crew (such as Olivia and Isabel Reiter) attach these iPhones to various stands and mounts positioned at the best angles for you to see our staff, then every camera is turned on and controlled by the central iPad. There is some set up needed on the iPad, which Pastor Loli does weekly, such as making the text boxes with scriptures, sermon title, hymn lyrics, etc. Then we perform a sound check and we press "Go Live". We've tried our best to keep all the cables

and technology out of view of the cameras, but when we're able to be "in-person" again, you'll see the intricacy of this system.

Like I mentioned, if you're interested in learning how you can assist with this team, we'd love to show you the design, since we intend to maintain use of our streaming capabilities even when Covid-19 is far behind us. Remember, even through this difficult time period, it is important for us to continue learning- "Give instruction to the wise, and they will become wiser still; teach the righteous and they will gain in learning." Proverbs 9:9.
