So, be <u>intentional</u> about how you proceed with your holiday planning and celebrations this year.


How can we celebrate in ways that are less stressful?



Soon we will not be able to go into a store without hearing recorded "holiday music." It is all right to enjoy it (or not) but the chance to experience a fresh LIVE performance is at our doorstep.


Every year during Advent, members of this church present an original cantata, a program of Scripture readings and songs celebrating the coming of Christmas. And thanks to the creative work of Logan Sorey our choir recorded a cantata last year despite the pandemic.

For 2021 the choir, enhanced by the festival singers, is preparing **"Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus"** to be presented as part of the combined worship service on **December 12**.

As in past years additional singers, our much beloved "festival singers," will be joining voices with the choir in cheerful and prayerful expectation. Over my 20 years here I have seen people coming together and enjoying the practices as much as the final result.

Practice is on Wednesday evening at 7:30 pm and the cantata part usually ends about 8:00 pm (loosely speaking!) Our regular choir stays on a little longer to prepare for Sunday and you are free to stay or leave as you wish. Happy days are coming! -- Sheila Donohue



WORSHIP IN THE SANCTUARY

Well, it's been a few months of being in the sanctuary with the contemporary service, and it feels great- for so many reasons. Firstly, the time spent apart due to Covid sure reminded us of how much we miss being the whole church and also hearing our voices all mingled together. Additionally, we're dialing in the new sound system more and more each week, and it's sounding really great. Finally, there is new music that has come out as contemporary worship recording artists have had many months to work in studios.

One of my particularly favorite artists, David Crowder, just released an album called "Milk & Honey" which he began writing after the big tour WinterJam was shut down like so many things in the Spring of 2020. Crowder says of that time, and while he was writing this album: "We may feel like we're in the wilderness right now, but I believe God's with us- I believe he's still present, I believe he's still active and I think we're going to get to sing about the beauty on the other side of this when we're done. So, all the songs were pretty hopeful, they weren't bleak."

One of my favorite songs from this album I'll be teaching us soon: "God Really Loves Us" was the last song written for the album, as Crowder was wrapping up sessions and finally being able to collaborate with other musicians. Crowder tells us that he wrote this song with the hope of it being sung loudly in the churches as we come together again, as a community; understanding God better because we're next to one another.

So I invite you to check out the album and the song, both available to listen for free on YouTube- as well as to continue making steps back into the church as you feel comfortable to do so. It is always a wonderful thing to look out from the stage to see new faces, and faces we haven't seen in a while. Take care, TJ

MISSIONS HAPPENINGS

Save the Date: **November 5th and 6th yard sale** in the church Fellowship Hall. Your help and gently used unwanted items are needed. We 're taking small donations of items now, please put them in room 8; bring larger items the week before the sale. Proceeds from this sale will go toward The Deep Well and general mission projects. The Congregation and VBS have **donated \$6,717.00 to The Deep Well Project**.

The Mission team has matched \$4,000 giving us \$10,717! We are more than 2/3 of the way to our goal of \$15,000. Please continue to donate towards this wonderful project that will eliminate thousands of steps for a whole community to get clean sustainable water. Again as mentioned we will use ½ of the money earned in this next yard sale towards the Deep Well.

Our Second Annual 5th Saturday Serve was a great success. We were able to buy \$800 worth of materials and build 6 picnic tables for Cedarkirk. We also made homeless bags, a hot meal and a bag lunch for the homeless population in the Gibsonton area. We had over 25 people volunteer and we all had a great time. We plan to make this an annual event and hopefully next year we won't be limited in what we can do in the community. Again thank you for all that you do so that we can serve as the hands of God.

Bikes for Jesus

For the past several years, we have been able to give Beth-El Migrant Mission and Foster Angels bikes. Last year because of Covid19 and all the company shut downs, we were not able to buy many bikes due to shortages and high prices. Your support was tremendous and we were able to buy and build about 30 small bikes and then gave gift cards to teens in Foster Care and at Beth-El Migrant Mission.

We seem to be in the same predicament this year. Bikes for teens are extremely expensive and we cannot buy small bikes in large numbers and we have been asked by Beth El and Foster Angels to donate items for teens as they are often left out. We would like to ask the congregation who have not donated money to the Bikes for Jesus Program to consider buying a larger 26 "bike and bringing it to church on dedication Sunday. We have a goal or 30 bikes.

We will still put together the smaller bikes on Saturday, December 4th at 8:30 am -

Tenting treatment for termites is scheduled for November 29, so the entire church campus will be off limits 11/29 through 12/1. More details will be made




